


Munisthai Championship



Dogra ruler, Maharaja Hari Singh, is credited with establishing the first legislature in the state of Jammu and Kashmir.

'Praja Sabha' was the name given to the first of its kind representative legislative assembly in Jammu and Kasmir.

The Constitution of
Jammu and Kashmir
(Sixth Amendment) Act,
1965, changed the
nomenclature of Wazir-eAzam (Prime Minister) to
Chief Minister and Sadare-Riyasat (President) to
Governor.

Ghulam Muhammad Sadiq was the last Wazir-e-Azam (Prime Minister) and the first Chief Minister (renamed position for Wazir-e-Azam) of Jammu and Kashmir.

The Constitution of Jammu and Kashmir was adopted on 17 November 1956, and it came into effect on 26 January, 1957.



Breaking the Silence: Stigma Around Women's Mental Health in India

Introduction

Mental health is a crucial part of overall well-being, yet it remains one of the most misunderstood and neglected areas—especially for women in India. While women face unique mental health challenges due to biological, social, and cultural factors, the stigma around discussing these issues keeps many of them silent. This silence is not just personal—it is societal.

Why Women Are More Vulnerable

Women in India often juggle multiple roles: daughter, wife, mother, caregiver, employee. These roles come with emotional and physical demands, but very little support. Common mental health issues in women include:

- Depression
- Anxiety
- Postpartum depression
- PTSD (especially from domestic or sexual violence)

😃 The Stigma: What It Looks Like

Despite growing awareness in urban areas, mental health remains taboo across much of India. Here's how stigma shows up:


- "It's just stress, stop overthinking."
- "Log kya kahenge?" (What will people say?)
- Fear of being called "mad" or "crazy."
- · Being labelled as "weak" if they seek help.

Many women fear rejection from their families or even their in-laws if they open up about their mental health struggles.

- Cultural and Social Factors
- Patriarchy: Traditional gender roles expect women to be emotionally strong and self-sacrificing.
- Lack of Awareness: Many people still don't understand that mental illness is real and treatable.
- Financial Dependence: Women dependent on family or spouses may have less control over their health choices.
- Limited Access: In rural areas, mental health services are either unavailable or hard to access for women.
- Voices That Need to Be Heard

In recent years, brave Indian women—including celebrities like Deepika Padukone—have spoken publicly about their battles with depression and anxiety. This has helped start conversations, but a huge gap still remains, especially in smaller towns and rural regions.

OPERATION SINDOR



OPERATION SINDOOR

Operation SINDOOR emerged as a calibrated military response to an evolving pattern of asymmetric warfare, one that increasingly targets unarmed civilians along with military personnel. The terrorist attack on tourists in Pahalgam in April 2025 served as grim reminder of this shift. India's response was deliberate, precise, and strategic. Without crossing the Line of Control or international boundary, Indian forces struck terrorist infrastructure and eliminated multiple threats. However, beyond tactical brilliance, what stood out was the seamless integration of indigenous hi-tech systems into national defence. Whether in drone warfare, layered air defence, or electronic warfare, Operation SINDOOR marks a milestone in India's journey towards technological self-reliance in military operations.

Air Defence Capabilities: Tech as the First Line of Protection

On the night of 07-08 May 2025, Pakistan attempted to engage a number of military targets in Northern and Western India including Awantipura, Srinagar, Jammu, Pathankot, Amritsar, Kapurthala, Jalandhar, Ludhiana, Adampur, Bhatinda, Chandigarh, Nal, Phalodi, Uttarlai, and Bhuj, using drones and missiles. These were neutralised by the Integrated Counter UAS (Unmanned Aerial Systems) Grid and Air Defence systems. Air Defence systems detect, track, and neutralise threats using a network of radars, control centres, artillery,

and both aircraft- and ground-based missiles. India's Air Defence Systems, combining assets from the Army, Navy, and primarily the Air Force, performed with exceptional synergy. These systems created an impenetrable wall, foiling multiple attempts by Pakistan to retaliate.

The Integrated Air Command and Control

System (IACCS) of the Indian Air Force brought all these elements together,

providing the net-centric operational

capability vital formodern warfare.

India's strategic calculus in Operation Sindoor was informed by an unwavering objective: to uphold national sovereignty and protect civilian lives without precipitating a broader military conflagration. By confining military action to terrorist infrastructure, India underscored its non-escalatory posture and respect for established international norms. Pakistan's reputation as the epicentre of global terrorism is rooted in a number of instances, there are several terrorist attacks around the world where Pakistani fingerprints have been found. Earlier in pursuit of justice for the victims of terrorist attack be it Mumbai in 2008, Pathankot in 2016, Pulwama in 2019 or many others, India provided forensic evidence and urged Pakistan to bring the perpetrators of these attacks to justice.





La question de la vie privée, car l'IA repose souvent sur l'analyse de grandes quantités de données personnelles,


Et le risque d'une dépendance excessive aux machines.
